- 1. Department of Mizo : Socio-Economic Status of Women in the Society at S. Lungleng Village
 - A study trip to South Lungleng village was organized by Mizo Department on 14th October 2015. It is interested to study socio-economic status of women in the society. Different views have been expressed about the status of women in the village.

From the study, the two concepts – status and role are inseparable but they are separate concept. Status is a collection of rights and duties and can be expressed through a medium of an individual. Role represents the dynamic aspects of status. The individual occupy the status socially assigned to them. In a deeply communitarian society like Mizoram, where social life is free and men and women mixed together freely, it is possible for an outside observer to think that there is no distinction between men and women in the society. This judgment may not be entirely accurate in the sense that Mizo society is indeed free so far as the mixing up of men and women are concerned. But, the fact remains that despite all their social freedom and their significant contributions in the family, women are not liberated and they are regarded as subordinate to men and they discriminate against in various aspects of life.

When we look at the present situation of women at South Lungleng village, they have been making significant marks in many aspects of life. Doors have been opened for women in the village but in a limited way. Modernization, it is argued is largely in terms of material culture, whereas traditionalism still influences the society at the level of consciousness and ideas.
